

OUR NSSON

Our main mission is to work with marginalized communities of citizens in an unconventional creative form using the means of theatre, performing arts, dance or singing.

> Theatre With No Home (herein after referred to as DBD) provides a platform for presenting social topics that are being overlooked in the commercial artistic sphere. We combine the artistic with the social in order to help tear down stereotypes that marginalized communities face in the society.

DBD was informally founded in 2005 in the course of work on theatrical projects with people without a home and it became registered with the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic on 12.5.2006 under the registration number VVS/1-900/90-28231. Members of the organization are people, who are in the long run engaged in the social, educational or artistic practice, economy, management and advertising.

We are based in Bratislava. Currently, we have nine members, several volunteers and many supporters.

Our community of actors and actresses is made up of people without home, physically disabled, people from socially underprivileged communities, social workers, theatre artists and anyone who is interested in our theatre. Our actors and actresses receive financial compensation for performing in our theatre plays.



We have built on a successful last year project LaborA and linked theatrical work with work on the restoration of the theatre hall and theatre equipment.

DRAMA BORA

In Slovakia, there is no long-term support provided to organizations that work with homeless people. If such support exists, then it is ill-conceived, without strategy and often nonrecurring. The only donor that supported our theatre work in the long run is actually SE ENEL through its endowment fund at the Pontis Foundation.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

To organize 90-hour drama-therapeutical workshop and premiere new theatre play.

To organize 30-hour ergo-therapeutical workshop and revitalize movable platform.

To play 8 theatrical performances in Bratislava.

To play 1 theatrical performance outside Bratislava.

THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT

Theatrical rehearsals in which 15 actors / actresses artistically produced, were held regularly throughout the project, in total duration of 100 hours.

We have introduced 2 premieres:

Theatre of the oppressed – Primeiro passo "Female" project Krasojazdkyňa (The Equestrienne) – staged reading associated with performative elements.

We have revitalized part of our theatre premises (entrance into the left wing) and movable platform, which we are using during the performances. Ergo-therapeutical workshop lasted more than 50 hours and involved all the actresses/ actors.

We played 9 theatrical performances for the public in Bratislava.

We played 2 theatrical performances outside Bratislava. Performance Platea at the 2014 Pohoda festival and performance of Kuca Paca at the BALVIT festival in Kokava nad Rimavicou.

Our theatrical performances during the whole project were seen by 1000 spectators.

PROJECT IN 201

Theater of the oppressed is a method developed by the Brazilian theatre director Augusto Boal during his artistic work with the poorest in ghettos of Sao Paulo. The method uses theatrical language as a means of finding possible alternatives, solutions or starting points, for example in conflict resolution, trying to reflect on the current situation and thus that leads to a social change, but at the same time it is also fun. DBD actors and actresses using this method bring to the stage personal experience of oppression they experienced during their life not only on the street.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

Create a theatrical performance using a special drama-therapeutical technique "theatre of the oppressed". Transfer and process in theatre performances topics of xenophobia and discrimination against the homeless and the disabled. Premiere Theatre of the oppressed in Bratislava.

THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT

The team of actors participated on 40 regular two-hour rehearsals.

We have rehearsed performance Theatre of the oppressed - Primeiro passo, which brings to the stage the story carrying signs of discrimination, xenophobia and oppression that our actors have experienced at first hand.

We have actively involved audience into the performances. We organized a public rehearsal, which attended 20 viewers.

The premiere took place on 29 October 2014 in the left wing of Pisztory Palace in Bratislava, 60 viewers accepted the invitation.

PROJECT IN 2014



The International Festival of homeless and disabled theatres ERROR is the only festival in Europe aimed at theatres in which the homeless people perform.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

It creates a space where theatre groups that work with marginalized groups present to the general public the original theatrical productions. The theatres make visible various social topics that are often not shown by professional theatres. It is a platform where "healthy" majority meets the people who are socially and culturally excluded. It helps break down stereotypes that exist against the homeless and assist their re-socialization. In 2014 our invitation was accepted by the community theatres from the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Slovenia, Germany, Armenia, Turkey and Slovakia. These theatres work with the homeless, physically and mentally handicapped persons, with drug addicts, refugees and otherwise socially excluded and disadvantaged people.

We have increased a visibility of the social issues that commercial arts often overlook. We have brought together different nationalities in the common artistic activity. We established alternative arts events. We removed the stereotypes that exist against marginalized groups in the society. We made visible various community theatres. We organized the festival with international participation. We organized a press conference.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

Decrease social exclusion of homeless and handicapped people by getting public more sensitive and reduce xenophobic oral attacks and racism against homeless by theatre art.

PROJECT DURATION

April 2014 – September 2015

THE MOST IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES IN 2014

Drama-therapeutical rehearsals: rehearsals with 2 hours duration, in which actors/ actresses, drama-therapists, assistants for handicapped people and technical team met. Rehearsals contained physical and voice exercises, movement exercises, work with body, work on acting expression, practicing social skills, creation and practicing theatre performance "Theatre of the oppressed". The activity will also continue during the year 2015. **Premiere of Theatre of the oppressed** – **Outro passo** was the highlight of the project. The theatre performance created during the rehearsals was presented to the international audience at the ERROR 2014 FESTIVAL.

Theatre performance in Bratislava: Theatre performances Bábka (The Puppet), Zázračné dieťa (Magic child) and Kuca Paca were played for public in Bratislava once per month. Transport from/to performances for handicapped people was provided by specially adjusted vehicle. The activity will also continue during the year 2015.

Theatre performances out of Bratislava:

Two theatre performances of our repertory will be played out of Bratislava. During a 2 days theatre tour we are going to play a theatre performance in the theatre /non-theatre space and we will present the artistic works of actors/actresses of DBD. There will be a discussion with audience after the performance. The activity is planned during the year 2015.

Cooperation with partnership organization from Iceland and with town hall of City of **Reykjavik:** Three experts from partnership organization Reykjavikur Akademian arrived to Bratislava for 7 days. We taught these experts technique of theatre of oppressed on a workshop we organized for this purpose. Actresses from Iceland were also involved into the theatre performance "Theatre of the oppressed – Outro passo". The theatre performance had premiere at the ERROR 2014 festival.

Three drama-therapists (two men and one woman) of our organization will travel to our partner in Iceland for six days. They will attend 20 hours' workshop, where their Icelandic partners will teach them the "Bibliodrama" technique. This activity is planned during the year 2015.

THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT

Since April 2014 we have organized and attended 35 rehearsals with 2 hours duration, where we have been practicing a new theatre performance called Theatre of the oppressed - Outro passo. On rehearsals we have artistically practiced with 12 actors /actresses.

The premiere of this performance was at the International festival of homeless theatres ERROR 2014 on 29 November 2014. Our partners from Iceland cooperated at the premiere. Our audience consisted of 300 foreign and domestic audience. Since April 2014 we have played 6 theatre performances for public for free. We organized 25 hours' workshop, where we taught our Icelandic partners the theatre of the oppressed technique. Icelanders brought situation of oppressing from their real life. This situation was adapted and applied to the theatre performance and played during the premiere at the ERROR 2014 festival.

THE RESULTS OF THE PROJECT

Creation of 50 minutes of staged reading, which has movement-performance elements. Actresses of DBD read the texts. With kind agreement of Oskar Rozsa parts of songs from Barfly group are used.

The premiere was on 30 June 2014 in the left wing of Pisztory palace in Bratislava for audience of 60 people.

PROJECT IN 2014 13

We became a partner in a two-year long international project that brings together arts-educational community organizations from six EU countries (England, Poland, the Netherlands, Slovakia, Germany, Belgium) dealing with informal education and social integration of older people in cultural and social events through the theatrical arts.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

Build the partnership among organization from six different countries using participatory theatre in socio-educational context.

Involvement of at least 60 adults who are educated (including older ones) from six countries by means of participatory theatre.

Learn attitude towards aging in six different countries and cultures across Europe, exploring the similarities, contrasts and comparisons.

Provide an opportunity for older people to be creative.

Learn theatrical techniques and also create and present the performances based on their own ideas and experiences. Evaluation of the impact and effectiveness of participatory theatre as the tool to improve the emotional well-being and mental health, confidence, feeling bigger awards in the community, improving self-assessment and reducing the isolation.

Enable older participants to work closely with younger people.

Use the theatre as a mean for better understanding of the people from different cultures and generations.

Exploring a wide range of methods and approaches, sharing of skills among members of the participating organizations that work with older people on participatory theatre base.

Enhance practice within the partners on European level and spreading the results of partnership.

MONTH WITH NO HOME

Theatre With No Home entered into "Mesiac bez domova (Month with no home)" activity. It was the first city festival in Bratislava aimed at support of homeless people. Events within the festival were organized by organizations helping homeless people (Theatre With No Home, Vagus, Depaul Slovensko and Proti prúdu).

The festival took place from 13 November until 13 December 2014 under the sponsorship of Andrej Kiska, the President of the Slovak Republic.

The main objective of the festival was to draw the attention of the public to the bad situation of homeless people. We have created a social order for public representatives where we made facts about homelessness more visible, described situation of homeless people in the capital city and pointed out that there was not accepted concept for solution for homelessness in Slovakia.

THEATRE WITH NO HOME BECAME PART OF THE CITY FESTIVAL:

By playing theatre performance Bábka (The Puppet) followed by discussion about "Alternative ways in homelessness solution".

Organizing of two days International theatre festival ERROR 2014.

Attendance on our performances was higher than 400 people.

The social order was signed by 1.012 signatories.

Our theatre performance saw more than 1.500 people.

On 15 December 2014, our actor Zdenek Langer suddenly died at the age of 62 years. He played in our theatre for more than 6 years. His last role of professor Šrámko in our newest theatre performance of the Theatre of the oppressed – Outro passo was unforgettable.

Zdenek Langer played in 6 theatre performances, was an excellent friend, kind hearted person, specialist for reconstruction of facades, the actor with special charisma and incredibly funny person. The last rehearsal of the Theatre of the oppressed in 2014 was, unfortunately, for Zdenek, his very last one.
